Amir Nadimi, the applicant, addressed the Commission regarding the application. The plan is to do an addition on the back of the house where the deck is and extend the kitchen and living room.

Scott Stevens, Soil Scientist, Wetlands were inspected twice; once back in 1988 and in April of this year. Wetlands are 135 feet from the proposed area of activity.

Commissioner Reed asked if this was a boundary change request.

Ms. Noble stated that since it was not done by the developer back in 1988, it makes it more difficult for the applicant to do it now, as two adjacent neighbors would need to be involved to accurately reflect the soil scientist findings. If the boundary change was proposed at the property line, the applicants would still fall in the upland review area and be subject to Commission approval for the proposed addition.

Commissioner Fisk invited Contractor Michael Aronne to speak.

Mr. Aronne, 102 Pleasant View Ave, stated he took the map from the Soil Scientist and measured from where the activity would be and it is with 135 feet.
